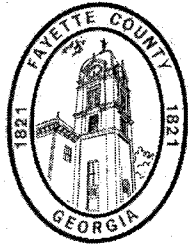
The Historical Society was chartered Spring of 1972. This would be a good time to recognize the people who are listed as the first 101 members
