General P. A. McGlashan of Savannah, commanding the Ga Division of Confederate Veterans will not be able to attend the reunion to be held in Macon. General McGlashen sustained a stroke, while said not to be severe, will incapacitate him from the trip. The General is over 75 years old.

Colored Veteran Honored

The funeral of Amos T. Rucker, the antebellum

Negro, took place in Atlanta a few days ago. He was a member of Camp Walker Confederate Veterans, which followed the body to the grave as an honorary escort. among the pallbearers were former Governor Allen D Chandler, General A. J. West, Judge W. Loundes Calhoun, Dr. Amos Fox and R. S. Osborn. Rucker followed his master, "Sandy" Rucker through the Civil War in the Thirty-third Georgia Infantry, and has been a familiar figure at Confederate reunions for years.

## November Meeting

The speaker for the Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup> meeting is David Carmicheal. He will be speaking on the Georgia Archives at the Research Center at 195 Lee Street at 3:00 p.m.

David Carmicheal is the Director of the State Archives of Georgia, the agency responsible for all records management and archival functions of the state. Prior to coming to Georgia in 2000, he established the archives of Westchester County, New York, and for 16 years managed the archives, records center, and knowledge management services of the county. He has been an adjunct professor in the graduate programs of New York University and Long Island University and has served as a consultant to state and local governments and to many corporations, including (his favorite) Jim Henson Productions.

David received his Bachelor's degree in History and English from Asbury College and his Master's degree in History and

Archives from Western Michigan University. He is a member of many professional associations and currently serves as President of the Council of State Archivists. In 2004, the American Association for State and Local History published the second edition of his book, *Organizing Archival Records: A Practical Method of Arrangement and Description for Small Archives*.
