Troops Surround Indians

Chief Kannop of the Utes Defies
Soldiers of Uncle Sam

"We are going to visit Chief White Cow Bull of the Cheyennes at any cost, and will not be taken back to Utah to starve, we would rather die first"

Is the substance of the answer of Chief Kannop to the soldiers, according to a news special from Sheridan, Wyoming.

The Indians are getting bolder, and pay no attention to the soldiers. A fight was almost started Monday night when an Indian encountered a sentinel of the 10th cavalry. The Indian refused to turn out of the path., and rudely bumped against the soldier. Only the intervention of some cavalry men prevented a serious encounter, as other Indians came up.

Colonel Hensel, who was a government scout and interpreter in the Battle of Wounded Knee, says the Indians mean to fight. And gives it as his opinion that they have sent messengers to seek assistance of the warlike Cheyenne.

The Indians say they want President Roosevelt to give them the Powder River Valley for a hunting ground.

The settlers along the Powder River say that if the Indians are allowed to remain in the vicinity the settlers will organize and exterminate the red skins. In spite of the troops.

Doc Holliday: The Life and Legend

Doc Holliday: The Life and Legend is a new biography on the western legend by Gary L. Roberts. Dr. Roberts is Emeritus Professor of History at Abraham Baldwin College.

The professor covers Doc Holliday through his youth in Griffin, Fayetteville and Clayton County. He explains the family connections among locals. The book covers his education and his time in dental school. The tale continues through the West, where Dr. Roberts used newly discovered primary sources to follow Doc through the towns and different conflicts with the law and politicians. He discusses the differences in the legend and the facts. He answers questions from previous

accounts of actions using local newspapers and court records.

The book has received good reviews and should be available at the library soon.
